- ⇒ Make sure your alarm company has your physical address—not a mailing address on file (street address or blue sign address).
- ⇒ Ensure the alarm company has updated key-holder phone numbers.
- ⇒ Test your alarm once/month as per your alarm companies test procedures.
- ⇒ In case of repeat nuisance alarms, have the alarm company come and do a service call on your system.
- ⇒ Do not place smoke detectors directly outside the bathroom door as to prevent steam from the bathroom triggering the alarm.

WATER RATIONING

During May to September, each year, all residents are required to practice water conservation for outdoor watering. Properties ending in an odd number may water on odd number days only and properties with an even number may water on even days only. Thank you for helping to conserve our water.

2018 WATER SERVICE RATES—Bylaw 2018/01

Single family dwelling units;

\$52.50 for the first 15 cubic meters and 3.00 for each additional cubic meter of water thereafter.

Commercial and industrial units;

\$62.50 for the first 15 cubic meters and 3.00 for each additional cubic meter of water thereafter.

Public and institutional schools;

\$65.00 for the first 15 cubic meters and 2.75 for each additional cubic meter of water thereafter.

Churches, clubs, associations, charitable organizations;

\$30.00 for the first 15 cubic meters and 3.00 for each additional cubic meter of water thereafter.

Additional fees

Disconnection fee: \$30.00

Reconnection fee: \$30.00

Transfer arrears from utility to tax roll administration fee: \$30.00

Flat rate for all mobile home units and damaged meters—\$97.00/billing period.

Penalties

A (3.9%) percent penalty shall be added to the outstanding current balance if payment is not received at the Town office by the date indicated on each bill.

2018 GARBAGE FEE—Policy 26

\$21.50/month billed bi-monthly

Please ensure when making any online payments to the Town of Millet, the account number matches the account you are paying to avoid it being applied to the wrong account (ie. utility, taxes etc.) — When entering your account number online, please do not include the decimal point. Thank you.

PLEASE REPORT INCIDENTS TO R.C.M.P.

If you see any criminal activity or are victim to a break in, please contact the R.C.M.P. immediately at 780-312-7267. Even if nothing was stolen, the detachment needs to be aware of any activity happening. Also be advised that the Community Peace Officer **does not** have jurisdiction for any criminal code, his area is bylaw and traffic. ALL other incidents must be reported to the R.C.M.P.

TAX DEADLINE

The 2018 Tax and Assessment notices are scheduled to go out in May. **Remember** that the deadline for tax payment, without penalty is **June 30, 2018**. If we have not **RECEIVED** by June 30th, there will be an 18% penalty.

Anyone that was on the pre-authorized payment plan last year **DOES NOT** need to reapply. If you would like to sign up for the 2019 plan, you must do so **PRIOR** to December 10, 2018.

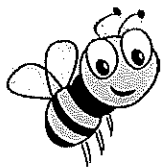
Vinegar Weed Control Recipe

MAKE YOUR OWN PLANTERS TUFA Recipe

Ingredients: (in Parts/Volume)

1 part - Cement
1 part - sand
2 parts - Peat Moss
1 - 1.5 parts - Water approx.
Can be colored to taste.

Directions

1. Mix dry ingredients together
prior to adding water
2. Add water at 1 - 1.5
parts/volume depending on
consistency of sand
3. If desired add a choice of
cement coloring as you mix.
4. Line your mold with a plastic
liner (such as a plastic bag)
5. Scoop mixture into the mold
and pack edges and base of the
container. Walls should be at
least 1" thick. The mixtures
consistency should allow you to
squeeze a little bit of water out
of each handful.
6. Add drainage holes to the
base of your container.
7. After 3 days, remove the
container from the mold.
8. Use a wire brush to bring out
the rough texture of the sand
and stones in the container.

Organic waste only / 40lb MAXIMUM. Use Clear Bags only and place on the front curb by 7am for pick up. Branches must be bundled together and no longer than 3' in length. Collected **May 1 to Oct 31, 2018.**

L = LAGOON / BURN PIT

Open every other Saturday 8am - noon **May 5 to Oct 27, 2018.** Clean combustibles and organic waste only such as trees, branches, and untreated lumber.

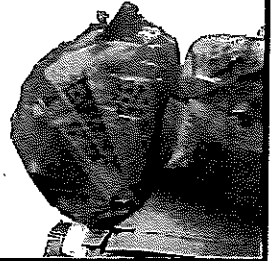

BLUE BAG

Curbside Recycling Program

SERVICE PROVIDED:

blue bag recycling



WHAT CAN I RECYCLE?

The blue bag system is designed to accept household paper, cardboard, tin & plastic containers. Please fold down and collapse all cardboard you intend for recycling. Uncollapsed cardboard will not be collected.

WHEN WILL BLUE BAGS BE COLLECTED?

Most collection occurs weekly. Please visit www.gflenv.com for more information. Keep blue bags at least 3 feet away from regular garbage. Blue bags must be out in the open and clearly visible. Blue bags in garbage enclosures or containers will not be collected.

WHAT SHOULD **NOT** GO IN THE BLUE BAG?

- Plastic toys
- Bubble wrap / Plastic film
- Styrofoam
- Un-rinsed food containers
- Diapers
- Toxic items (batteries, paint cans, aerosol cans)
- Electronics or small appliances
- Ceramics
- Scrap metal or wood
- Food or yard waste
- Coloured & clear glass jars
- Soiled paper (used tissue or paper towel, pizza boxes smeared with cheese, etc.)
- Soiled containers

WHAT CAN I RECYCLE?

Newsprint/Heavy paper: newspaper, magazines, phone books, catalogues, flyers

Mixed Paper: office paper, junk mail, shredded paper, etc.

Boxboard: cereal boxes, pasta boxes, etc.

Containers: milk jugs & cartons, food cans, beverage containers, plastic containers #1-7.

Corrugated cardboard: flattened and folded beneath the blue bag.
