COUNCIL NOTES

It's hard to believe that the year is half over. We've survived the spring drought and are now well into the summer rains.

Council met on June 19th. At that time it was reported that current taxes are being paid, but there are nearly \$100,000.00 in prior year taxes outstanding. Regrettably, there will be several properties on the tax recovery list unless payments are forthcoming.

There were several Fort McMurray evacuees who made Vilna their home base during the month that they were away from their homes. The generosity of those who provided accommodations, those who worked at the evacuation centre in Smoky Lake, those who donated to the evacuation effort shows how a small community can make a difference during an emergency.

The Fort McMurray Disaster opened a lot of eyes and left a lot of us asking "Would we be ready if a fire engulfed our community?" "Do you know what to do if you're ordered to evacuate your home NOW?" Are you prepared to survive in your home if the power, gas and water services are disconnected? Let's be prepared!

The Vilna Emergency Preparedness Committee has scheduled a PUBLIC MEETING for Thursday, September 14th, 2016 at 7:00 p.m. at the Cultural Centre.

BE PREPARED FOR THE CARBON TAX (Levy).....

Effective January 1, 2017 the Province of Alberta will be initiating a Carbon Levy. There is no question that it will affect each and every one of us. In order to offset the impact of "Climate Change", we will be required to pay to the province a levy as follows:

FUEL TYPE	January 1, 2017
Diesel	5.35 cents per litre
Gasoline	4.49 cents per litre
Natural Gas	\$1.011 per gigajoule
Propane	3.08 cents per litre

Unfortunately each of these charges is going to affect the operating costs of the municipality.

HOW TO BE A GOOD NEIGHBOUR....

- 1. Cut your lawn before the dandelions go to seed or the clover is in full bloom;
- Cut the grass behind your fence and on your boulevard;
- 3. Keep your dog on your own property and if you're walking it, keep it on a leash;
- 4. Pick up after your dog;
- 5. Train your dog to stop barking at everyone who walks by;
- 6. If you're not home, make sure your dog is not left outside;

FIRE PITS and BURNING

Remember, *only recreation fires* are permitted within the Village at any and all times. The only exception is when a permit has been issued by the Fire Department.

- The size of your fire pit is restricted to 32 inches in diameter (82 cm);
- It must be no closer than 14.8 feet (4.5 meters) from any building, property line or combustible material;
- Keep it covered with spark arrester mesh;

Every Owner or Occupier who builds, ignites or allows a fire in an approved fire pit must ensure that:

- Only dry or seasoned wood intended for recreational purposes is used (this means no tree or brush trimmings, grass clippings or treated wood, absolutely no garbage);
- A means of extinguishing the fire is kept on hand at all times while the fire is burning;
- The flames from the fire do not exceed 1 meter in height at any time:
- The fire is supervised at all times by a responsible person;

 Prior to leaving the fire, the fire is extinguished completely, leaving only cold ashes.
