

BYLAW 619

A BYLAW OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF THE TOWN OF ELK POINT IN THE PROVINCE OF ALBERTA, TO AUTHORIZE VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTERS TO USE FLASHING GREEN LIGHTS IN THEIR VEHICLES.

WHEREAS, Section 59.1 of the Highway Traffic Act, being Chapter H.7 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta 1980 and amendments thereto, gives municipalities the power to pass a bylaw allowing full time and volunteer firefighters to use flashing green lights in their vehicles as a means of identification;

THEREFORE, the Council of the Town of Elk Point, in the Province of Alberta, duly assembled, enacts as follows:

1. A full time or volunteer firefighter may carry on or in a vehicle, other than an emergency vehicle, a lamp that produces intermittent flashes of green light and may operate the lamp in the Town of Elk Point if the vehicle is proceeding to a fire or other emergency.
2. No person other than a full time or volunteer firefighter shall operate a lamp that produces intermittent flashes of green light.
3. Nothing in this Bylaw shall be construed so as to permit a full time or volunteer firefighter to operate a vehicle in contravention of the Highway Traffic Act, the regulations under the Highway Traffic Act, any other provincial legislation or regulation, or any Bylaw of the Town of Elk Point
4. This Bylaw shall come into force and effect upon the final passing thereof.
