Municipal Bylaws

Bylaw No. 19

A BYLAW TO REGULATE THE DISPOSAL OF GARBAGE AND TO PROHIBIT THE OBSTRUCTION OF ROADSIDE DITCHES

WHEREAS under the provisions of *The Town and Village Act*, 1952, control of public streets located in the Summer Village of Silver Beach is vested in the Council of the Summer Village,

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Summer Village is given power to regulate the disposal of garbage and other refuse within the Summer Village of Silver Beach,

BE IT THEREFORE enacted by the Council of the Summer Village of Silver Beach as follows:

3. No person shall place or cause to be placed any garbage or other refuse of any sort upon any public street or in any ditch appurtenant thereto, nor shall any person place any material of any sort in any said ditch which will have the effect of restricting the flow of drainage waters therein.
4. No person shall make or construct, or cause to be made or constructed, any entrance-way across a drainage ditch located on a public street in the Summer Village without first obtaining a Building Permit. Provision must be made to permit the flow of water under such entrance-way by at least a 12-inch concrete culvert.

Any person who violates any provision of this Bylaw shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding \$100.00, exclusive of costs, and in case of non-payment of the fine and costs, shall be liable to imprisonment, with or without hard labour, for a period not exceeding sixty days in a common gaol.

In addition, if the Summer Village is required to take any remedial measures to repair any condition which is the result of a breach of this Bylaw, then the expenses of any such remedial measures shall be charged and recoverable from the person responsible for the offence.
