### **CURFEW BYLAW**

The Town of Millet has made changes to their curfew bylaw. Anyone under the age of 16 years old, is not allowed out in public, without a parent or guardian, between the hours of 10pm and 6am. If caught, you could face a fine of \$100 and the parent or guardian could face a fine of \$300 for first offence, and \$150 and an additional \$300 for any subsequent offence.

**PLEASE BE ADVISED**, the town only employs one Community Peace Officer, so patrolling the streets at all hours is not possible, if you see a youth on the street after curfew, **PLEASE CONTACT THE R.C.M.P. at 780-312-7267.**

### **MILLET WATER—Yes, it is safe**

The letter from Alberta Health that was sent out in the last newsletter stated that the fluoride levels in the water were higher than average **NOT** that the water was unsafe in any way to consume. The main risk with too much fluoride is enamel fluorosis, typically slight whitish lines on a tooth, But, often fluoridated toothpaste is the cause of fluorosis, not fluoridated water. Very often fluorosis can be prevented by parents supervising toothpaste amount used by children. "The fluoride levels are due to "natural fluoride" the town does not add additional fluoride to its water. The town has been approved for water for life and are currently awaiting engineers to complete the water line to bring in regional water to Millet.
