Winnie became a favorite of Christopher Robin Milne and inspired the stories written by his father, A.A. Milne, about none other than Winnie-the-Pooh.

1930– The Mundare choir won first prize at the Festival of Nations at the Palliser Hotel in Calgary. Groups were brought in from across Western Canada. (made possible by Mr. Korchiski and O.
