## Schedule "A"

### 1. Fire Services Fees

<b>Unit Response:</b>	
Command Vehicle	\$180/hour
Rescue Truck (includes up to six members)	\$615/hour
Pump Truck (includes up to five members)	\$615/hour
Note: These rates are to be adjusted annually on April 1st, using the inflation formula established in the Highway Maintenance contract as established by Alberta Transportation.	
<b>Manpower:</b>	
One Man Hour	\$36/person
<b>Supplies/Materials</b>	
Fire Dept. supplies at current replacement cost of supplies used plus 25%	
Annual Special Provisionary Fireworks License	\$100
<b>Inspections:</b>	
Annual Fire Safety Inspection	\$75
Occupant Load Certificate	\$50
<b>False Alarms:</b>	
Charges to a property owner who fail to notify the Fire Department when work is being done on a sprinkler or alarm system, or in the activation of false alarms;	
First Response	No Charge
Second Response	\$100
Third Response	\$200
Fourth Response	\$300
Each Subsequent Response Thereafter	\$300
