



2018 Ma-Me-O Beach Council Priorities – Information for Residents

In January, 2018 Ma-Me-O Beach Council held their annual strategic planning session. Please read on for information on what was reviewed at the session.

Wastewater Management

Regional Line:

The Regional Line Phase I from the Village at Pigeon Lake to the Mulhurst Lagoon is complete and in active use. Design engineering for Phase II which will run from The Village at Pigeon Lake to Grandview / Poplar Bay is complete and the project will go out for tender in the near future.

Local Collection Line:

The local collection line, although delayed, is nearing completion. The pressure testing is underway and the heat tracing lines are being tested. The Contractors will be returning in the spring to complete remediation of driveways, roads and park areas.

Wireless Internet

Council continues to look for ways to improve the wireless system. Bandwidth costs are expected to drop this year. Council will look at increasing bandwidth at that time.

Municipal Addressing

Emergency services personnel have advised us that there are still municipal addresses missing on some cabins. They further advise that in an emergency, lack of signage can cause a delay in reaching your neighbour in need. Address numbers should be at least 3.5 inches tall, reflective, and in a contrasting color to the background. A separate letter will be sent to property owners with missing or inadequate signage that provides a list of suppliers and cost estimates for addressing signs.

Roads / Sidewalks / Signs / Drainage

Roads and sidewalks will be addressed next year as part of the wastewater project remediation.

Drainage on 6th and 7th Streets will be examined prior to any roadwork on these streets.

Policing

Ma-Me-O Beach Council has contracted with the RCMP for enhanced policing again for 2018. We have contracted with the RCMP for a total of 512 service hours.
