



Ma-Me-O Beach Wastewater Project

May 2018 Update

Local Municipal System

The Ma-Me-O Beach local wastewater project is nearly complete. The final pressure testing is underway. Clean up and rehabilitation of roads, driveways and the Day Park has started with most of the work to be completed once the frost is out of the ground. The contractor will restore the damaged areas to a condition that is the same or better than the pre-construction condition.

We have requested that a first pass to fill in holes and trenches be completed before the May long weekend.

Council has enacted two Bylaws related to the Wastewater System. Bylaw 361 relates to the Municipal Wastewater Utility. You will be provided a copy of the bylaw when you request connection to the system. Bylaw 362 is the new Wastewater Bylaw that applies to anyone who does not connect to the Municipal Wastewater Utility.

Both Bylaws are available for viewing on the website.

On Lot Installations

A group of Ma-Me-O residents have worked with the certified installers to look for opportunities to save money through bulk installations.

The certified installers have provided quotes to a number of residents and we understand that installations will begin soon.

Next Steps

To become active on the Municipal wastewater system, follow these steps:

1. Evaluate quotes for on lot work and hire your certified installer.
2. Confirm that the installer has Superior Safety Codes perform the plumbing and electrical inspections.
3. Bring a copy of your paid invoice to the Summer Village Office.
4. Sign the Wastewater Service Agreement.

Your property will then be added to the list to have the cc (isolation) valve opened and you will then become active on the system.
