Lagoon Expansion Project

You will have noticed an additional \$25 per quarter on your utility bills – the purpose of this fee it to fund the development of a new lagoon expansion. The lagoon is the facility where all wastewater for the community is routed to be cleaned before being released to the environment. The current lagoon is undersized to meet our community's current needs and prevents new growth and development.

The Town is planning to expand the lagoon capacity to support our growing community. A "SAGR" system has been chosen because not only does it meet new regulations and support the population and growth projected into 2035 but is also sustainable and environmentally responsible. This new design will reduce the environmental footprint significantly by removing all three cells in the flood plain of the Souris River and placing all treatment and storage cells within the existing primary cell. Further benefits include the ability for easy expansion in the future, the reduction of odour and positive environmental benefits by improving the quality of water released onto the flood plain and into the Souris.

Initial planning work to prepare for construction has been taking place in order to apply for federal and provincial grants.

What's with the Water?

The Town is aware that there have been sporadic issues with water quality around the Town. The problem is that the water tables are low due to dry conditions last year, therefore we are pulling up all sorts of sediment that are not usually present in our water supply, mostly minerals. The



treatment process takes time to adjust and we are working hard to stabilize it. We are hopeful that with the release of northern dams more clean water will be available. We ask that you be patient while we work with the Water Security Agency and Public Health. While the water may not be esthetically pleasing, it is not dangerous to your health.

IMPORTANT NOTICE! Additionally, we have planned to "swab" all the water lines in May to remove some of the residue that inevitably builds up. We will post more notices before that occurs, as there will be a period that we will recommend against washing clothes at the same time.

Are You Building or Renovating? Permits May Be Required!

Please note that building and development permits from the Town of Oxbow are MANDATORY in ANY of the following cases:

- Where there is new development;
- Where there is a structural change to the building;
- Where there are electrical changes;
- Where the structure will be attached to the ground;
- Where the structure will be greater than 100 square feet;
- Where the structure will be greater than \$5,000 in value;
- For all demolitions.

This includes, but is not limited to decks, sheds, garages, additions, and renovations. It is always in the homeowner's best interest to receive a building / development permit to ensure insurance coverage on your policy. Your insurance policy may be void if the proper permits have not been received.

All fees required by the development and building permit process are required to be paid up front. Development permits are only valid 12 months from the date of issue. 


Thank You Volunteers
