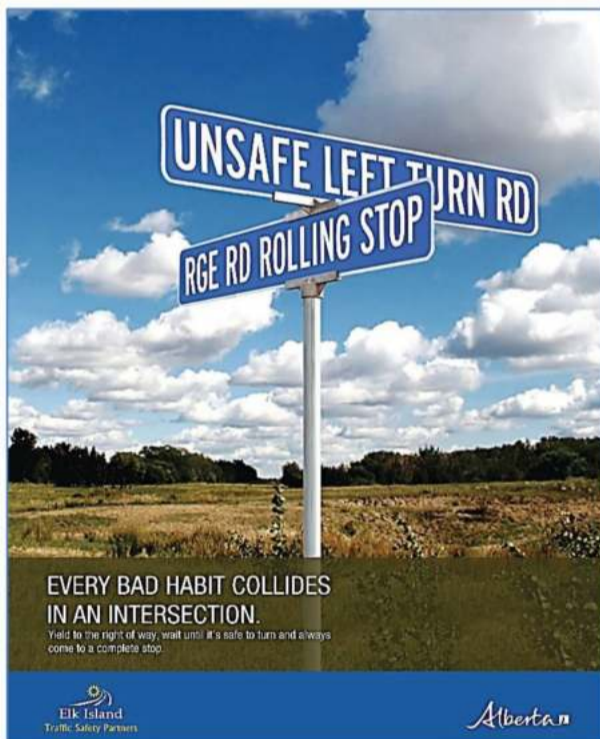

Caution Clearing Driveways Do Not Push Snow Across Roads!

Please remember, as you are clearing your approach from snow fall, Do NOT push the snow across the county road.

The movement of snow across a roadway can often leave ridges, ruts or piles of snow that become dangerous and could cause damage to the motoring public; you, the landowner, could be held liable.

When plowing out your own driveway or having a private contractor plow, the snow MUST be pushed back onto the resident's property or to the right side of the approach and must be pushed away from the driving lanes, NOT across the road into the opposite ditch. This allows the grader operator to lessen the amount of snow left at driveway entrances.

Councillors' Corner

Notes from the January 8, 2019 Council Meeting

Motions from In-Camera

That the 2009-2018 property taxes in arrears in the amount of \$99,711.93 be cancelled as of December 31, 2018, and an application be made for the eligible credit properties outlined in appendix A to the Provincial Education Refund Credit for Uncollected Education Property Taxes on Oil and Gas Properties Program.

Drainage Master Plan

2018 was an exceptional year that saw the extremes of a fast spring melt on frozen ground resulting in extensive overland flooding and severe damage to both private and public property. Council had requested Administration provide a Terms of Reference for a Drainage Master Plan, so a consultant can be contacted to review drainage across the County. Council approved the Terms of and directed Administration to determine the costs associated with a two-year work schedule for development of the Plan.

Snow Removal Flag Policy

Discussion was held regarding Policy 5100 for Custom Snow Plowing/Grading on Private Driveways, and the liabilities and costs associated with Lamont County Public Works providing private driveway clearing services. Council requested that Administration review the policy and report back to Council.

ASB Notes

Notes from the January 9, 2019 ASB Meeting

Drainage Maintenance Update

Drainage continues to be a priority for ASB with progress for maintenance of registered drainages in Lamont County being reviewed at every ASB meeting. The ASB requested administration continue maintenance and work on the Lafarge, Hrudehy, Sunland and Serediak drainages as necessary, and as conditions allow.

Grazing School for Women Sponsorship

The 2019 Grazing School for Women will be held in Lamont County in June at the Lamont Ag Society Grounds and St. Michael Hall. As the 2019 host, Lamont County ASB chose to donate \$1500.

Alberta Invasive Species Sponsorship

Because of the important role that the Alberta Invasive Species Council has in educating Albertans about the destructive impacts of invasive species, ASB approved sponsoring the Alberta Invasive Species Council for \$1000.
