MUNICIPAL ENFORCEMENT

When traveling in town and on highways, loads must be secured to prevent falling onto the road OR shifting within the vehicle. If any load falls onto the road, the driver is responsible to take all reasonable precautions to safeguard traffic and remove fallen debris from the highway. Recommendations include: having all loads secured by tarpaulins/cargo netting and/or tie downs prior to departure.
