Update on Grandview Construction Projects September 19, 2019

1. Wastewater System

After almost two years of construction, the Grandview Wastewater System became operational at 1 p.m. on September 17, 2019. The first eleven pumps were turned on, and flow was established to the Regional Wastewater System using the Crystal Springs bypass. Pump commissioning will continue throughout the village for all properties that are ready. Residents who have not yet done so should be arranging for electrical service to their tanks to facilitate pump installation and commissioning.

Until pumps are commissioned, residents must continue to monitor their tanks. Please advise THS when the fluid in your pump chamber has reached a level sufficient to start the pumps (at the top of the biotube).

It was almost two years ago (October 16, 2017) when the installation of the mainline through the summer village commenced. Installation of the service connections to residential holding tanks followed. Pump installations began earlier this summer and are progressing well.

We are looking forward to having everyone connected to the system and to eliminating the few remaining septic fields in our Summer Village, as required by our wastewater bylaw.

Landscaping and tank repairs are also progressing, and we anticipate having this work completed in the next several weeks.

Your Council and administration appreciate all the support and patience you have shown as we have progressed through this endeavour, the largest capital project ever undertaken by our Summer Village.

2. Road Construction Project

The rebuild of the Grandview road system with cement stabilization and chip sealing was completed last week. Loose chips will be swept off the road sometime before winter, and any required touchups will be completed at that time.

We have already had complaints about speeding and hope all residents will abide by the posted speed limits to keep the road safe for pedestrians, cyclists, and children, as well as other drivers. We will be reminding the RCMP of the need for traffic monitoring.

Again, thank you for your consideration and patience during this construction period. A special thanks also goes out to Ant Construction from Red Deer, who conducted this project in an organized manner with a minimum of inconvenience to residents.
