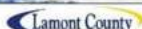

Road Maintenance Supervisor (Full-Time Permanent)

Lamont County is seeking an experienced and highly motivated individual to join our team as the Road Maintenance Supervisor!

Reporting to the Director of Public Works, the Road Maintenance Supervisor is responsible for managing staff in the supervision, planning, coordination and organization of road maintenance functions such as roadway graveling, routine and planned preservation maintenance works, winter snowplowing, sanding operations, culvert repair, signage, and heavy equipment operations.

This position will provide civil engineering design and construction management support in preparation for in-house major maintenance activities such as surveying and drafting proposed works, materials selection, road strengthening and culvert renewal, gravel pit management, and managing outsourced construction activities.

Responsibilities will include assisting with records management, budget control and contract supervision as required. This position will coordinate road maintenance operations with the Grader Supervisor.

- Diploma in Civil Engineering Technology or an equivalent area of study; with a Certified Engineering Technologist (C.E.T) designation.
- 5+ years supervisory experience in rural roads maintenance and construction practices.
