Appeal by March 4, 2020

1. Legal Description: NW 4-57-20-W4 Land Use: Heartland Agricultural Industrial (HAI) Proposal: Stripping and grading of approx. 32 ha for the purpose of stockpile storage and slurry line network, sediment drying bed, laydown and storage including tanks, drums, waste bins, vehicles, silos, equipment and materials, fabrication and manufacturing of industrial or agricultural equipment, material transportation and distribution, equipment and trailer repair/maintenance.

The Land Use Bylaw provides that the person applying for the permit or affected by the order, or any other person affected by an order, decision or development permit of a Development Authority may appeal to the Subdivision and Development Appeal Board within twenty-one (21) days after the date of notice.

Seasonal Spray Truck Operator

Duties and Responsibilities:

- Providing spray services by assessing and documenting areas to be sprayed, locating spray areas on map, operating sprayer truck, truck and side-by-side mounted spray equipment, maintaining accurate records, and creating detailed reports of herbicide applications.
• Maintaining spray equipment and herbicide management by using appropriate personal protective equipment, following safe work practices and procedures, containing any spills, replacing spill kit, monitoring and servicing equipment.
• May include assisting with Weed Inspection or other Provincial Surveys.

Qualifications:

Education in agriculture, environmental or biology fields and experience in the agricultural/environmental industry is required. Knowledge of the Weed Control Act, Agricultural Pests Act, Integrated Pest Management, herbicide selection and weed identification, and a valid Alberta Pesticide Applicator's Certification or eligible to obtain a licence or Authorized Assistant certification is ideal.

Seasonal Weed Inspectors

Duties and Responsibilities:

- Receiving and responding to weed complaints, conducting field inspections and weed identification.
• Advising landowners of their weed control responsibilities.
• Issuing of enforcement notices as required by the Agricultural Service Board and the Weed Control Act.
• Assist with annual crop pest surveillance, including insect and crop diseases.

Seasonal Vegetation Management Technician

Duties and Responsibilities:

- Receiving and responding to weed complaints, conducting field inspections and weed identification.
• Advising landowners of their weed control responsibilities.
• Issuing of enforcement notices as required by the Agricultural Service Board and the Weed Control Act.
• Assist with herbicide applications for weed control.
• Assist with annual crop pest surveillance, including insect and crop diseases.

Qualifications for Weed Inspector & Vegetation Management Technician:

The successful applicants shall be a student or a recent graduate of a post-secondary program in Environmental Sciences, Science, or Agricultural Studies from an accredited institution.

Notes from the February 11, 2020, Council Meeting

Council Code of Conduct Bylaw

Pursuant to section 146.1 (1) of the Municipal Government Act, a council must, by bylaw, establish a code of conduct governing the conduct of councillors. The purpose of this Bylaw is to establish standards for the ethical conduct of members relating to their roles and obligations as representatives of the Municipality and a procedure for the investigation and enforcement of those standards. Council gave first reading to the bylaw and deferred the second and third readings until all councillors can be present for discussion.

Penalties on Oil and Gas Companies Property taxes - Motion Amended

At the January 27, 2020, Special Meeting of Council, the following motion was approved: 20-030. WOITAS: that Lamont County Council cancel the penalties in the amount of \$374,623.02 that are directly related to the cancellation of \$2,875,438.92 in property taxes for oil and gas properties. An error was discovered in that motion between the spreadsheet information and the actual penalty calculations in the taxation ledger. The actual penalties are \$268,894.49; the remaining \$105,728.53 relates to a duplication of roll numbers on the spreadsheet. Council agreed to amend Motion 20-030 to replace the cancellation of penalties in the amount of \$374,623.02 with the amount of \$298,894.92.

A donation request was received from Lamont Veselka Dance group to go toward their 50th anniversary celebration taking place in 2021. Council agreed to donate \$250.

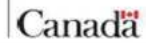
