Changes to 2020 Program**

**ATTENTION: Changes to 2020 Strychnine Sales**

Due to the Agricultural Services office being closed to the public, the following protocol for strychnine sales has been put in place:

- 1) Customers MUST call to book an appointment to pick up 2% Strychnine.
- 2) Waiver form paperwork needs to be completed prior to pick up.
  - Forms are available on the Lamont County website at [www.lamontcounty.ca/pest-control-programs](http://www.lamontcounty.ca/pest-control-programs).
  - Paperwork can be done onsite; you must have the following information:
    - Mailing Address
    - Farm Size
    - Home Quarter Legal Land Location
    - Infestation Legal Land Location (if different from Home Quarter)
    - MUST KNOW: number of estimated areas to be treated; Crop, Forage, Pasture in acres
    - How many Bottles are required (1 Tablespoon per gopher hole)
- 2) Forms can be emailed to [bonnie.c@lamontcounty.ca](mailto:bonnie.c@lamontcounty.ca) or faxed to 780-895-2892.
- 3) Payment is by CHEQUE only! Made out to Lamont County.
- 4) Strychnine will be set out by the Agricultural Fieldman once proper identification is given.

The **FINAL** decision to release product is at the discretion of the Agricultural Services Department.

**ORDER BY THE VEHICLE WEIGHT COMMITTEE**

Order No. 01-2020 Defining Maximum Allowable Weights Permitted on Certain County Roads.

Pursuant to the authority granted under the provisions of By-Law No. 449/87, the Vehicle Weight Committee orders that effective **March 30, 2020 at 8:00 a.m.**, percentage axle weights for Municipal Roads are:

RR 195 from Twp Rd. 550 south to Hwy 16 – 50%  
Twp Rd. 550 from RR 204 to Hwy 831 – Hwy 15 – 50%  
Twp Rd. 534 from Hwy 855 to RR 170 – 50%  
**Twp Rd 520 from Hwy 855 to RR 163 – 50% NO TRUCKS OVER 1 TON**

RR 195 from Jct Hwy 15 to Jct Hwy 29 – 100%  
RR 202 from Jct. Hwy 15 to Access Road (Paved Road) – 100%  
RR 204 from Jct. Hwy 38 to Sil Silica Access Road (Paved Road) - 100%  
RR 165 from south Hwy 45 to Twp. Rd. 565 east to NW-29-56-19-4 – 50%  
RR 195 from Hwy 16 South to Blackfoot Camp – 50%  
RR 185 from Hwy 29 to Twp Rd 560 – 75%  
RR 170 from Twp Rd 580 to Twp Rd 574 – 75%  
RR 170 from Twp Rd 574 to Hwy 45 – 75%  
Twp Rd 574 from RR 165 to RR 170 – 75%

Hamlet of Hilliard Streets – 50%  
Twp Rd 561 including Hamlet of Star from Hwy 831 to RR 193 – 50%

All other County gravel roads – 75%  
All other County oiled roads – 75%

- \*Twp. Rd. 560 from Hwy 831 to RR 200 north to Graymont Site SW-6-56-19-4 – 100% (Bonded)
- \*RR 203 from Jct. Hwy 45 to Cenovus Access Road – 100% (Bonded)
- \*RR 180 from Hwy 45 north to Twp 574 Spur Petroleum site (SW-18-57-17-4) - 100% (bonded)
- \*Twp. Rd. 562 from Hwy 45 to RR 203 north of Tamarack NW-16-56-20-4 site – 100% (bonded)
- \*RR 182 south on Hwy 45, 200m east into Perpetual well site – 100% (bonded)
- \*RR 183 north to Twp 572, west to RR 184, south to Hwy 45 Perpetual – 100% (bonded)

This order rescinds order number 03-2019 and shall remain in effect until further notice.

An Environmental Farm Plan (EFP) is a voluntary, whole farm, self-assessment tool that helps producers identify and mitigate their environmental risks.

Environmental stewardship is important in agriculture and to the end-user of agricultural products. In order to be eligible for some grant funding through the Canadian Agricultural Partnership (CAP) programs, an updated EFP is required.

**Enforcement of Alberta's Public Health Act**

Please be advised that, by way of Order in Council (#100/2020) through Ministerial Order (MO #23/2020 & MO #24/2020), Lamont County Community Peace Officer has the authority, responsibility and duty to enforce Alberta's Public Health Act (PHA) by:

- i. Providing law enforcement services or other related duties in relation to Alberta's declared state of public emergency relating to COVID-19; and
- ii. Acting at the request of any police service in Alberta, Alberta Emergency Management Agency or any Government of Alberta Ministry.

**Penalties:**

- \$1000.00 + \$200.00 = \$1200.00; or
- **Mandatory Court** appearance (for public interest factors).

Public and Private gathering have had the numbers reduced to a maximum of **15 people**. In addition, people must observe two metres of social distancing, this includes:

- **OPEN SPACES** such as trails, fields and parks; and
- **PUBLIC and PRIVATE GATHERINGS** where people are brought together in a single room or space at the same time, including funerals, weddings and other formal and informal events (such as birthdays and anniversaries).
- **Dine-in Restaurants** will no longer be able to offer dine-in services. Take-out and delivery services continue to be available.

It is requested that everyone obeys the regulations set out by the Government of Alberta to stop the spread of the COVID-19 virus.
