Summer Program Leaders and Leaders in Training

FCSS Lamont County is looking to fill five Summer Program Leaders and five Leaders in Training positions for the Summer Day Camps program held within Lamont County.

Responsibilities for **Leader in Training (L.I.T.)** (14-18 yrs old) include assisting the Summer Program Coordinator & Program Leaders to:

- Facilitate summer day camp activities, Ex: games, crafts, activities, etc.
- Participate actively
- Ensure the daily safety and wellbeing of participants
- Plan for supplies and equipment as needed.
- Provide leadership and mentoring of participants
- Participate in team leadership development, team meetings and training workshops

Responsibilities for **Program Leader** include assisting the Summer Program Coordinator and same as above, as well as:

- Plan, coordinate and facilitate safe and fun-filled summer day camps for children coming out of grades 1 – 6.
- Communicate with parents on a daily basis
- Assist in registration

Qualifications:

- Knowledge and experience working with children and teens
- Strong interpersonal, communication and team leadership skills
- Maturity, high energy and enjoys children
- Creativity, ability to adapt and good sense of humor
- Ability to share skills and learn new ones
- Driver's license & reliable transportation (Program Leaders)
- Current First Aid/CPR or willing to obtain prior to start date (all)
- Child Welfare Information Clearance (18 & older)
- Criminal Record Clearance (18 & older)

Five **Summer Program Leader** positions are available. The position is temporary full-time, 7-8 hours per day, five days a week. This is a temporary summer position for the months of July and August 2020. The salary is to be determined.

Five **Summer Program L.I.T.** positions are available. This flexible volunteer position allows you to work up to 8 summer camp weeks in July and August 2020. You are required to attend the staff training days. The volunteer position is approximately 7 hours per day, 5 days per week. **For each FULL week that you volunteer, you will receive an honorarium of \$150 per week.**

NOTICE Spring Flooding Road Closures

Due to spring melt, which has resulted in overland flooding in some areas, there are a number of roads in Lamont County that have been closed for repairs. **It is essential that the public obey all road closure signs for their safety.**

Public Works staff are working diligently to reopen roads in a timely manner. Because of the frequency of changes, details on which roads are closed and which have been reopened are on the Lamont County website and are updated when necessary. NOTICE – Fire Restriction Issued

A **FIRE RESTRICTION** has been issued for Lamont County effective April 24, 2020, at 1:00 p.m. Fire hazard conditions have rapidly increased to the level where fires can start and grow quickly.

This fire restriction:

1. **PROHIBITS** the issuance of fire permits and the discharge of fireworks
2. **RESCINDS** all previously approved fire permits and fireworks discharge permits
3. **ALLOWS** safe fires in burning barrels provided they are equipped with metal mesh screens, located on a non-combustible surface a minimum of 3 meters from any combustible material including buildings
4. **ALLOWS** fire pits contained by non-combustible material with a metal mesh screen, as well as charcoal briquette barbecues, propane/gas barbecue, and propane/gas fire pits. All types must be supervised and extinguished before leaving unattended.

This fire restriction is in effect for all Lamont County rural areas, including Hamlets, and will continue until further notice.

Councillors' Corner

Notes from the April 22 Special Meeting of Council

Farmers Pumping Water Off Their Property

A complaint from a ratepayer was received regarding someone pumping water off of their property, which is causing drainage problems on other landowners' properties. Council advised Administration to reach out to other counties with bylaws for pumping water off of properties.

Lafarge Drainage

An on-going issue, a formal response was received from Alberta Environment, which advised that after 40 years of being altered, the drainage has become naturalized and would require a permit to alter the course, and that Lafarge has no legal responsibility for the drainage. Council requested to see the 2019 letter that was sent from Alberta Environment to Lafarge concerning the drainage on S1/2 27-58-16.

Road Bans

Lamont County Administration received information of a ministerial order that states that grain, seed and fertilizer products are now considered essential goods due to COVID-19 and as such are not subject to Municipal Road Bans. Council advised the Peace Officer to research the possibility of encouraging the use of haul routes.

NBI Feedlot Road Use Agreement

A complaint was received by the Peace Officer regarding disruptions to residents (noise/dust) from hauling on this road. Council advised Administration get a legal opinion on if private grain haulers are required to use the designated haul road. They also suggested considering adding the use of j-brakes to the Road Use Bylaw.

Shovel Ready Projects

Lamont County has developed a list of shovel-ready projects to submit to the Provincial Government for funding consideration. Projects under consideration are required to have long-term benefit contributing to job growth and economic health of the province.
