Appeal

The Land Use Bylaw provides that the person applying for the permit or affected by the order, or any other person affected by an order, decision or development permit of a Development Authority may appeal to the Subdivision and Development Appeal Board within twenty-one (21) days after the date of notice.

Appeal Fee - \$200.00

ASB Certified Organic No Spray Agreements

If you are a newly Certified Organic producer and are looking to sign a No-Spray Agreement, or if you are a Certified Organic producer that did not receive a renewal package, please contact the Agricultural Services department at 780-895-2585.

To renew your No Spray Agreement, Lamont County requires the following:

1. Completed and Signed Agreement
2. All legal land locations
3. Valid copy of Organic Certification

Operators will NOT be notified of your No Spray Agreement until ALL documentation is received. All agreements must be signed and returned by **May 15, 2019**. Please contact the Agricultural Services department with any questions.

NOTICE - Environmental Protection & Enhancement Act

NOTICE OF DECISION

In accordance with section 68 of the *Environmental Protection and Enhancement Act*, Lamont County has been issued an approval by Alberta Environment and Parks to apply pesticides within 30 meters of an open body of water under specific conditions for the control of invasive weeds (burdock).

The *Environmental Protection and Enhancement Act* may provide you a right of appeal against this decision to the Alberta Environmental Appeals Board. You should note that there are strict time lines for filing an appeal dependent on the type of appeal. If you choose to appeal this decision, please contact:

NOTICE Spring Flooding Road Closures

Due to spring melt, there are a number of roads in Lamont County that have been closed for repairs.

PLEASE NOTE: It is essential that the public obey all road closure signs and barriers for their safety. Anyone found not complying with road closures can be charged \$243 for failure to obey a traffic control device. Anyone found responsible for damaging signs or barricades can be charged with criminal mischief and will be required to appear in court and pay restitution.

Public Works staff are working to reopen roads in a timely manner. Details on which roads are closed and which have been reopened are on the Lamont County website at www.lamontcounty.ca/roads and are updated when necessary.

Hay Permits

Please be aware that anyone with intent to cut hay along any County right-of-way must first apply **and receive approval** for an annual permit from the County, at no charge.

PLEASE NOTE: As per Policy 6054, permits are valid from July 1-August 1, and hay must be removed from County right-of-ways within 7 days of cutting, or County Administration may invalidate the permit.
