NOTICE OF DECISION

Notes from the May 19, 2020, Special Meeting

Temporary Road Closure Bylaw 815.20

Lamont County Planning Department received a Development permit and a Temporary (Seasonal) Road Closure Application from Western Canadian Aerial Ltd. for the purpose of building a runway for agricultural spray planes. Council gave First Reading to Bylaw 815.20 to establish a temporary Road Closure of Range Road 191 and directed Administration hold a Public Hearing on June 9, 2020, at 9:30 a.m.

AIHA Heartland Incentive Program Policy

The Alberta Industrial Heartland Association (AIHA) will be presenting its Incentive Program Policy to its committee on May 29, 2020. The aim of the policy is to promote investment in Alberta's Industrial Heartland Energy Value Chain and Associated Infrastructure. Council approved the policy in principle and agreed to have Reeve Diduck support the policy at the meeting.

Council Code of Conduct Bylaw 814.20

During the March 10, 2020, Regular Council Meeting, Council gave First Reading to Bylaw 814.20, a bylaw to establish standards for the ethical conduct of Council members and a procedure for the investigation and enforcement of those standards. Council gave Second Reading to Bylaw 814.20 and agreed to postpone Third Reading until the June 9, 2020, Council meeting.

Sale of Crushed Gravel/Pitrun Cancelled
