LARGE ITEM GUIDELINES

July 18, 2020

Leave items at the curbside with your other garbage by 7:00 a.m.

Special notes:

- Houses with back alleys must have large items put out at the front of your property for collection.
- Put a note on items (basketball and hockey nets, lawn mowers, wheel barrows, rain barrels, bicycles, etc.) to help identify it is being out for pick up.
- All items must be less than six feet by three feet (1.6 metres x 0.9 metres) and weigh less than 200 lbs (90 kg)
- Limit of two items per household

Some examples of acceptable items for collection include:

| • stoves | • barbecues (no tanks) |
| • washer and dryers | • lawnmowers (all fluids drained) |
| • mattress and box spring | • rain barrels |
| • furniture | • snow blowers (all fluids drained) |
| • sinks | • lawn furniture |
| • toilets | • wheel barrow |

Items with fuel or oil tanks (barbecues, lawn mowers, etc.) must have fuel or oil tanks drained. Fuel and fuel tanks can be taken to an EnviroService Event.

Different trucks collect different items, and where possible, items are sent to be recycled.

Items which are **not acceptable** for collection include:

| • televisions | • snowmobiles |
| • stereos | • assembled swing sets |
| • computers (monitors, towers, key boards, speakers, mice) | • tires |
| • desktop printers | • propane tanks |
| • car parts | • items larger than 1.8 metres (six feet) in length |
| | • items weighing more than 200 lbs |

Various electronics not collected may be e-cycled.
